From the Pastor

For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith."

As the 125th anniversary celebration of Our Savior's is being prepared for, I would like to extend an invitation to members of the congregation to share your faith stories in the newsletter. The stories do not need to be lengthy, simply descriptive of a significant event or events in your faith journey and how faith has shaped your life. It is lives of faith expressed and lived out, individually and collectively, that are instrumental in forming and giving shape to the life and ministry of this and every congregation.

For me, faith has been a life long process of maturing as a child of God anchored in the gospel. The gospel, as Paul puts it, is the good news of God's defeating the power of sin and death through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, God's son. As for many, the story of my faith journey begins at the intersection of God's word, an element of creation, and my life, in the waters of baptism. It is in these waters that God's power to name, claim, forgive, empower, and send me were expressed.

The faith journey I have been led on is not one I, or anyone, might have mapped out like an itinerary for a trip. Rather, I have been led by one who keeps me grounded yet moves me in directions I often have not envisioned. Sometimes I have gotten sidetracked by options that looked easier or more desirable.

What helps remind me of who is to do the leading is an activity used when I was a counselor at a Red Willow Bible Camp. The activity was called simply a "trust walk". Two people and one bandana would take the time to negotiate their way around the camp. One person would put on the bandana and trust that their partner would not lead them into a tree or some other dangerous situation. Trusting is easier said than done. Even blindfolded, I found myself thinking I could negotiate the course without too much trouble, that is, until I would trip over a tree root or up a stair or even run into a tree, door or the volleyball net. It was only when I would trust the guide to lead me through the course of the guide's choosing that all would go well.

Where life is concerned, it is when I let the phrase made up of the letters of the word "faith" I learned years ago be operative, that the faith journey and the relationship that anchors it go well. The phrase is "Forsaking **All I Trust Him!**" This is not to say that sailing through life has been smooth without a ripple, wave or storm to challenge faith. It simply means that I am and always will be far from alone as this journey and maturing process continues. For there is a lot of truth to the saying that has been on t-shirts, as the caption for posters and the like, "Be patient, God is not finished with me yet".

What the map for the rest of my life will look like I do not know. What I do know is that the gospel, God's good news shared through Jesus, will continue to be the source of strength, hope, and guidance for faith and life. I look forward to hearing and/or reading some of your faith stories in the months to come.

One of the subjects of the assembly was the human sexuality policy of the ELCA. There was not a direct vote on the policy. The vote will be held in August at the Synod wide assembly in Minneapolis.

Pastor Dave reported on the discussions and topics of the assembly.

Oral Communications: A thank you was sent to the church from the WAO Ed Foundation for the use of the Church for the Celebrate Music and the Arts activity.

The Covenant Church donated \$500.00 for the billboard signs listing all of the Warren community churches that are planned to be located along the highways on the way in to Warren. Jim Folz also reported on verbal promises from other churches in the community.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship & Missions: No Report.

Worship & Evangelism: Jim Myrfield and Fredryce Sundby will be working on the planning committee for the 125TH anniversary. Carol Anderson reported letters will be drafted to invite former Pastors, etc. The Bishop of Northwest MN will be asked to give the morning sermon. Discussed encouraging members to attend the celebration. A theme will be discussed at the June council meeting. The council set a goal to have a theme by the July council meeting. It was suggested that the newsletter should have OSL trivia, bits of history, and should promote the 125TH anniversary.

Lawn Chair Sunday will be held on June 14TH in Holiday Park at 10:30AM. Grill, buns, meat, condiments, and drink will be provided by the Church. The rest will be pot luck.

May 31 will be new member Sunday.

Education: Ilene Estabrook reported on Education. VBS is still in need of volunteers.

The Sunday School Superintendent responsibilities will be taken on by the education committee. LeAnn Novacek will be the contact person. Rachel Roggenbuck will lead music.

Youth & Family: Pastor Dave reported on the funds raised by the youth for their New Orleans trip. The youth have asked for \$1,000 from OSL. Motion to approve by Jim Folz, seconded by Ilene Estabrook. Voted and approved.

Ilene Estabrook reported on the cleaning of the church by the youth group.

The youth group will have a carwash on June 3 and 4 to raise money for the New Orleans trip.

Rod Myrfield offered an opportunity for the youth to take part in an open house at his store on June 25TH.

Property & Management: Rod Myrfield reported on property and management. Glass has been ordered for the front door window. A price has not been submitted for the back door glass. Quotes will be for insulated glass.

Preliminary bids were submitted for bricks and mortar work. Karr Tuck pointing submitted a bid for \$26,600.00, and H&H Masonry for \$17,900.00 verbally. H&H Masonry is mailing a bid explaining their proposal. The bid from Karr Tuck pointing was very detailed and included all equipment. H&H Masonry's bid did not include some equipment necessary to complete the job. The project will be presented to the OSL congregation. A motion was made by Jim Folz to recommend Karr Tuckpointing's bid to the OSL congregation, seconded by Nick Johnson. Voted and passed. An announcement will be made to the congregation to explain that it has been noticed that the buildings brick and mortar need work. Contact Rod Myrfield with any questions. New Business: No new business.

Old Business: Discussed online directory. Pastor Dave reported on the online services that are offered by Life Touch and Olan Mills. Pastor Dave will gather more information on these services. Discussed scheduling a date for pictures and building a directory.

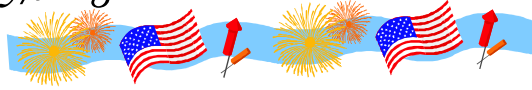

Connecting the Congregational, Synodical, and Churchwide Expressions of the ELCA

Recent Synod Assembly acts on social statement resolutions

ELCA Churchwide Assembly to Meet in Minneapolis, Aug. 17-23

Twenty representatives from the Northwestern Minnesota Synod will be among more than 1,000 voting members of the 2009 ELCA Churchwide Assembly August 17-23 at the Minneapolis Convention Center. Delegates will act on a proposed social statement on human sexuality, a recommendation on ministry policies, a proposal for full communion, and funding proposals. They will also conduct elections, and consider memorials and resolutions.

The assembly theme is "God's work. Our hands." Bible studies will be based on the Book of Faith Initiative, endorsed by the 2007 Churchwide Assembly. The initiative is intended to help ELCA members increase their biblical literacy. The Rev. Mark S. Hanson, in his eighth year as ELCA presiding bishop, will chair the assembly.

Each of the ELCA's 10,448 congregations may send one representative to the assembly as an official "congregational observer." More information about this can be found on the Churchwide Assembly website: www.ELCA.org/assembly.

The assembly will act on:

- a proposal for full communion between the ELCA and the United Methodist Church, adopted by the UMC General Conference in 2008
- a proposed social statement, "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust," requested by the 2001 ELCA Churchwide Assembly

- a "Report and Recommendation on Ministry Policies" requested by the 2007 ELCA Churchwide Assembly
- a fundraising proposal for a churchwide HIV and AIDS strategy
- A proposal for further development of a "Lutheran Malaria Initiative" (LMI) with Lutheran World Relief, the Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod, and the United Nations Foundation (UNF).

At the Northwestern Minnesota Synod Assembly in mid-May, delegates considered three resolutions dealing with the "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust" document as a possible social statement of the ELCA.

A "Resolution Rejecting Proposed Social Statement and Affirming Current Teaching Documents on Sexuality" was amended and defeated by ballot: Yes, 202; No, 256; Abstain 16.

A "Resolution Rejecting Recommendations on Ministry Policy and Affirming Current ELCA Policy" was amended and passed by a narrow margin: Yes, 225; No, 223; Abstain 13.

A "Resolution in Support of Two-Thirds Majority Vote" at the 2009 Churchwide Assembly was amended and passed by show of hands.
